36. Road that the Open Air Mercado is on - every Saturday mornings

38. Route to Singlar Marina (Provides dingy landing service and all standard Marina services)
39. Route to San Blas **Jungle Cruise** starting point. The must do panga tour starts at the base of the bridge (3hr tour)
This road will also take you to the hill-top fort and original town church circa 1788. Look for and follow sign to **La Contaduria** and take the up hill road. Bring your camera because you can see all of San Blas from the fort!

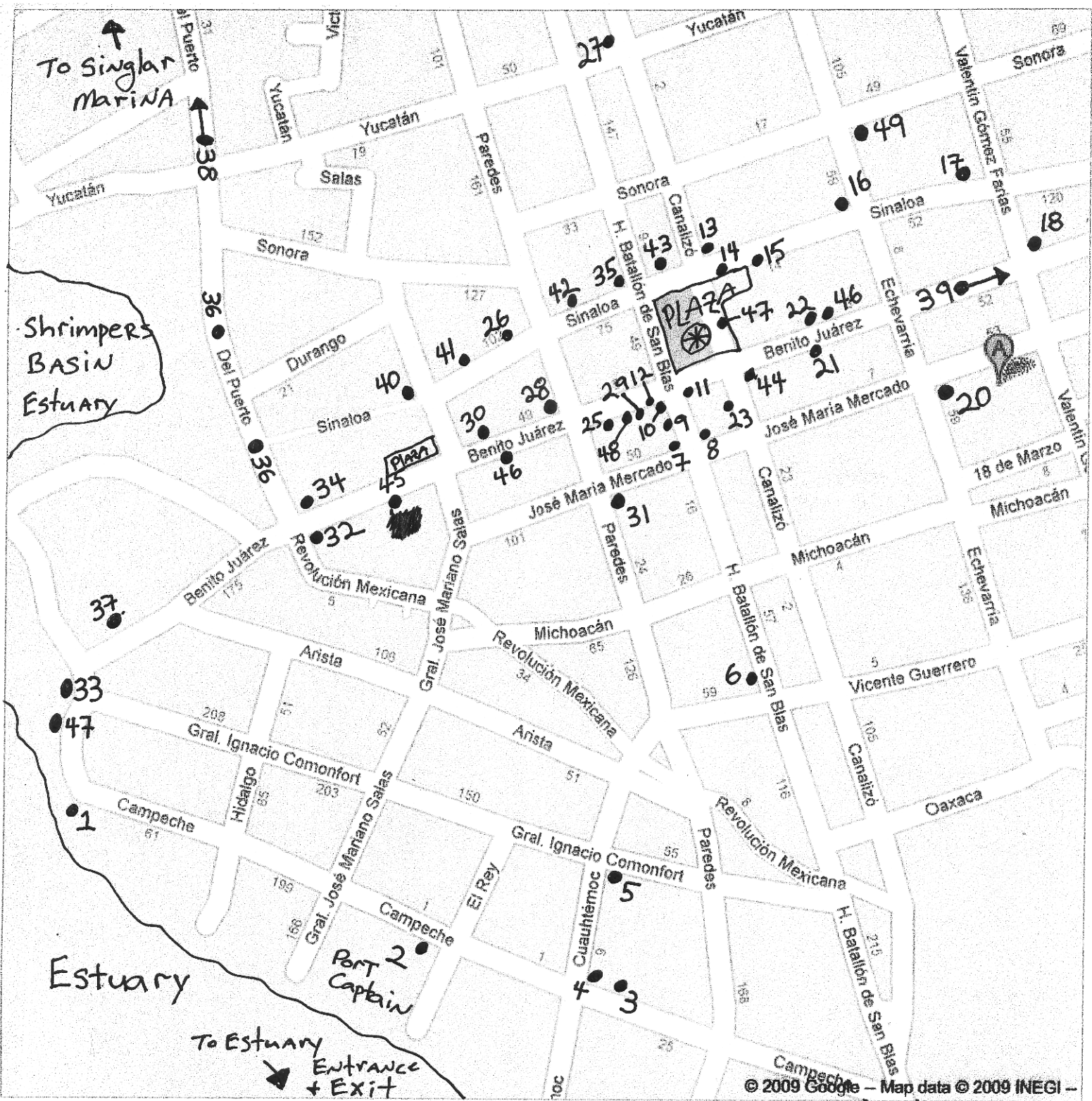
San Blas, Nayarit Estuary Entrance and Anchorage info (Marina hails on Ch 74)

The bar extends east off the west Jetty and there is some shoaling around the tip of the East jetty. Good anchoring in the estuary can be had on the West estuary side, keeping clear of the channel center and extends up the estuary past the Singlar Marina. There is a **Sand Bar** located just to the west of the Green markers leading into the marina.

Note: Depths were taken at high tide. Low tide depths can be 5ft lower on the low tide



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
